



EEC's plan to enhance Nepali IBOs

European Economic Chamber (EEC)-Nepal under the Asia-Invest Programme has started a project, 'Enhancing the Intermediary Business Organisations in Nepal' — funded by the European Union — targeting at the Nepali private sector to enhance the capacity of Nepali intermediary business organisations (IBOs) in a changed globalised competitive business environment.
